

**Minutes of Capital Review Committee Meeting**  
**August 10, 2004**

A CRC meeting was held on Tuesday, August 10, 2004 at 1:30 p.m. at the Responsibility Hall in the new Virginia Avenue Housing and the following was discussed.

**1. ARS Building Discussion – Continued – Scott Shader, John Gardner, Mike Roberts, Mike Chippendale, Henry White and H.R. Chandrasekhar**

Scott Shader began the conversation by stating that this was the continuation of the proposed new ARS Building. At the April 27, 2004 CRC meeting it was stated that some faculty/Colleges have issues regarding the construction of this new building. John Gardner indicated that Randy Miles, who runs Sandborn Field, is concerned about wind and shadowing effecting the crops at Sandborn Field. John Gardner stated that wind and shadowing programs were ran before the LSC was constructed and that the program could be recalibrated to show what effect the ARS build would have on Sandborn Field and that he would report back to the Committee with the results. Also, possible concerns from Arts and Sciences regarding the Planetarium were addressed. Henry White and H.R. Chandrasekhar stated that the LSC addition would substantially block the planetarium from the sky-view and suggested that the planetarium be moved from the roof of the Physics Building to a location south of town.

**Recommendation:** CRC agreed to continue this new building discussion and asked that Arts and Sciences begin discussions regarding a new future site for the Planetarium.

**2. Veterinary Medicine Building – Study to Reconfigure Entrance Concept Approval to Complete a Rendering – Larry Edwards**

Larry Edwards distributed a handout stating that the College of Veterinary Medicine (CVM) is seeking concept approval to reconfigure the entrance of the Veterinary Medicine Building and re-develop the surrounding grounds, including parking lot AV15, to improve the identity, image and usability of the CVM campus. The concept has been shared and discussed with the Architectural Review Committee and Perry Chapman, the Campus Master Planning Advisor.

**Recommendation:** CRC approved the concept so that a rendering can be prepared and utilized for fund raising activities but also recommended that it needs to be reviewed by the Board of Curators.

**3. Recycling Bins for Beverage Containers – Larry Edwards**

Larry Edwards distributed a handout stating that the Student Fee Capital Improvement Committee would like to purchase 50 recycling containers to place at various locations on campus, adjacent to sidewalk waste receptacles. Proposals are being requested from the City of Columbia and Civic Recycling to collect the material from these containers, which will result in some increased operational cost.

**Recommendation:** CRC approved this request as submitted.

#### **4. London Hall Accessibility – Jackie Jones and Larry Edwards**

Larry Edwards distributed a handout requesting an ADA accessible entrance to serve the basement of London Hall. The Center for Innovations in Education department is currently located off campus and is being relocated to the lower level of London Hall. The first floor of London Hall is accessible by a ramp on the south side of the building. The building does not have an elevator, therefore the basement is currently inaccessible. The College of Education is asking that the campus pay for this at the cost of \$12,000.00

**Recommendation:** Provost Deaton stated that he would follow up with the Dean of Education about this request. No Committee action was taken.
